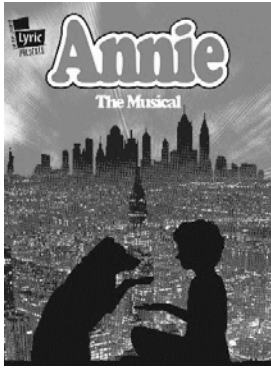
THE LYRIC CAPITAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE WELCOMES ROB PARZYCH AS ITS NEW CHAIRMAN

Adult Male Roles

Oliver Warbucks: Stage age 40-65. A powerful billionaire, who always has his mind on business, but has a kind heart looking for someone to love. He is self-assured and confident, focused and gently authoritative. Sings “Something Was Missing” and “I Don’t Need Anything But You.” Vocal Range: C to high F. Must be willing to SHAVE head (or already be bald).

Rooster: Stage age 30-50. Miss Hannigan’s greedy and dishonest brother. Rooster has a “smooth gambler” persona. Sings “Easy Street.” Vocal Range: B to high G.

Franklin D. Roosevelt: Stage age 40-65. The President of the United States of America, who takes an immediate liking to Annie and her optimism. Must be able to imitate Roosevelt. Vocal range C flat to E sharp.

Bert Healy: Stage age 30-55. A popular radio announcer. Sings “You’re Never Fully Dressed without a Smile.” Vocal Range: Tenor to F#. This role may be doubled with chorus.

Bundles McCloskey: Stage age 25-60. The laundry man who flirts with Ms. Hannigan and aids Annie’s attempt to escape. Spoken (no singing). This role is doubled with chorus.

Jimmy Johnson: Stage age 25-55. Silly radio personality on Bert Healy’s radio show. This role is doubled with chorus.

Fred McCracken: Stage age 25-55. Puppet wrangler. Uses a dummy on Bert Healy’s radio show. Baritone. This role is doubled with chorus.

Harold Ickes: Stage age 25-60. An associate of President Roosevelt. (Must be able to sing harmony.) This role is doubled with chorus.

Louis Howe: Stage age 25-60. An associate of President Roosevelt. (Must be able to sing harmony.) This role is doubled with chorus.

Drake: Male. Head butler in the Warbucks’ home.

Lt. Ward: Male. NYPD officer who is suspicious of Annie. This role is doubled with chorus.

Adult Female Roles

Grace Farrell: Stage age 25-35. Grace Farrell is Oliver Warbucks’ calm, cool and classy secretary. She appears business like when dealing with Miss Hannigan and Warbucks, yet maternal toward Annie. She always appears “in control” and sophisticated. She is likable, sweet and confident. Vocal Range: A to high G.

Miss Hannigan: Stage age 35-60. Desperate and unhappy with her lot in life, she is the alcoholic orphanage matron who is Annie’s nemesis. Miss Hannigan is a definite “has-been.” Her distaste for her job should ooze from every line she delivers. She must have a strong versatile singing voice and be able to create a character that is larger than life and funny. Sings “Little Girls” and “Easy Street.” Vocal Range: A to A flat.

Lily St. Regis: Stage age 25-35. Shady, floozy girlfriend of Rooster. She is always distracted, although she manages to pick up on any conversation involving money. Sings “Easy Street.” Vocal Range: D to high G.

The Lovely Boylan Sisters (Connie, Ronnie, Bonnie): Stage ages 20-40. Singing group that sings back up to Bert Healy. Must be able to sing well and harmonize. Roles are doubled in the chorus.

Star to Be: Stage age 18-25. Aspiring Broadway actress who sings during NYC. Mezzo. This role is doubled with chorus.

Cecille and Annette: Maids at Warbucks’ home. May double in the chorus.

Mrs. Greer: Oliver Warbucks’ head housekeeper.

Mrs. Pugh: Oliver Warbucks’ cook.

Adult Male and Female Chorus: Stage age 15 and up. Townspeople who appear in “Hooverville,” “NYC,” and may appear as servants at Warbucks’ Mansion. Additional assistants to FDR.

Child Female Roles

Annie: Stage age 11. Annie is a complex, tough, streetwise urchin who is surprisingly vulnerable when she thinks she might lose what has become most important to her: her newfound “family.” Can act motherly, independent, overwhelmed and hopeful. Must be strong vocally and musically and be able to light up the stage! Vocal Range: A to High F.

Duffy: Must be able to appear age 15. The oldest girl in the orphanage. Vocal Range: A to High F.

July: Must be able to appear age 12-14. The quietest girl in the orphanage. Vocal Range: A to High F.

Kate: Must be able to appear age 7-8. The second to youngest orphan. Vocal Range: A to High F.

Molly: Must be able to appear age 6. The youngest and smallest orphan. Vocal Range: A to High F.

Pepper: Must be able to appear age 10-14. The toughest girl in the orphanage. Vocal Range: A to High F.

Tessie: Must be able to appear age 9-11. This is the crybaby of the orphanage. Vocal Range: A to High F.

Orphan Chorus (2-3 additional roles): Stage ages 5-14. Sings. Voice Range: A to High F.

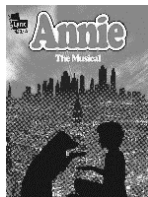
