Vermont Repertory Theatre and the Isham Family Farm in Williston have joined forces to celebrate the 400-year anniversary of the publication of the *First Folio*, and with it, humanity's first encounter with Shakespeare's first, shortest and funniest play, *The Comedy of Errors*.

The Comedy of Errors tells the simple story of a single day in the fantastical Mediterranean town of Ephesus along the Turkish coast. A cast full of crazy characters fall into a farcical plot that has more in common with an episode of *Modern Family* than anyone's idea of an Elizabethan drama. All three of these volunteers worked countless hours creating Debra the Dragon and their attention to detail was not lost on the audience. They also collaborated with the special effects team – Belinda Emerson and Julianne Nickerson - who added in the smoke. After all, you can't have a dragon without smoke. Kyla Paul Marchand and Ellie Wallace were a big part of making Debra come alive through their choreography and ability to move all the parts together simultaneously to look and act like a dragon. And lastly the actors who manipulated the various parts of Debra and gave her a voice. Hālee Bernier held the head and navigated the mouth and eyes: Tara Henry and Brianna Newman worked the wings and made Debra fly; Carah Pioli-Hunt and Kerry Powell maneuvered the tail; and Megan Ferris gave Debra a voice that captured the audience every show. The Dragon Team is a great example of how Lyric works together with all the different aspects of theater to create a magical moment on stage.
