Auditions are in-person only and will be held at the Lyric Creative Space in South Burlington. *The Prom* auditions will consist of a Dance Workshop/Audition, as well as a Traditional Audition, which includes a Vocal Audition and the performance of the Audition Monologue.

Pre-registration is strongly encouraged and can be completed on the Lyric website starting August 23. You only need to attend one night of auditions.

Should the team need them, callback auditions will be held Thursday, August 31. If you are needed for a callback audition, you will be called on Thursday, August 31, between 9 a.m. and noon.

Please note that all those auditioning must be at least 15 years old by August 27, 2023.

A NOTE ABOUT CASTING

Auditioning can be anxiety-producing for anyone, regardless of skill or experience level. We strive to work in collaboration *with* our performers, and to do that effectively we only ask that you bring your most authentic self into the room with you. We want to tell this story with folks who share some of the lived experiences of the characters in *The Prom*, which means we are seeking a cast that reflects the incredible diversity of communities like Edgewater, Indiana, and our own. All body types, expressions of gender identity, backgrounds, and orientations will be needed to accomplish this. Along these lines, please note that listed stage ages are only a starting point in the casting process, but it is important that we have an authentically intergenerational cast. Not every role will require a performer to have every skill required to tell this story, as there are roles more geared toward strong dancers, some that lean more toward musical skill sets, and some that require comedy chops. We look forward to meeting you!

CHARACTER DESCRIPTIONS

EMMA NOLAN (Female presenting, 16-18) Teenager in Indiana. A reluctant poster child for LGTBQ+ youth. Very smart. A bit of a tomboy quality. Wears their heart on their sleeve. Not your typical leading lady.

ALYSSA GREENE (Female presenting, 16-18) A cheerleader and top student. Secretly Emma's girlfriend. Faces constant pressure from her mother and friends. Tries desperately to fit in. Afraid to stand up to her mother.

MRS. GREENE (Female presenting – 40s) Alyssa's intimidating, conservative, single mother. The head of the PTA. Knows deep down that her daughter Alyssa is struggling with her identity. She is too afraid to face the reality because she fears her daughter will face a hard life.

DEE DEE ALLEN (Female identifying, 40-59) Broadway diva. A huge ego to match her huge talent. Hilariously self-involved but yearns to do something good for someone other than herself. Known for her strong Broadway belt vocals and large stage presence. Jaded with relationships, does not believe in true love until she meets Mr. Hawkins.

TRENT OLIVER (Male identifying, 30-40) Pretentious Juilliard graduate recently cast in the non-Equity tour of *Godspell*. Handsome, charming, funny and loves to hear himself speak.

ANGIE DICKINSON (Female presenting, 40-59) A long running ensemble member in the Broadway production of *Chicago* (20 years!). Jaded Fosse girl with a heart of gold.

BARRY GLICKMAN (Male identifying, 40-59) Flamboyant Broadway star. Completely politically incorrect and doesn't know it. Impulsive and loves to make a scene everywhere he goes. Longs to give Emma the prom he was unable to have as a teen. MARION HAWKINS (Male identifying, 40s) A small town principal. Easily flustered. Straight-laced. A Broadway enthusiast.

SHELDON or "SHELLY" SAPERSTEIN (Male presenting – 30-49) A charismatic press agent who works for both Dee Dee and Barry. Dry wit a must.

SHELBY/ENSEMBLE (Female presenting, 16-18) Popular cheerleader at school. Kaylee's second in command, and Kevin's girlfriend. Bullies, but eventually learns to accept Emma.

KAYLEE/ENSEMBLE (Female presenting, 16-18) Head cheerleader and lead mean girl. Nick's girlfriend. Every girl wants to be her, and every guy wants to date her. Bullies, but eventually learns to accept Emma.

NICK/ENSEMBLE (Male presenting, 16-18) Popular jock at school. Kaylee's boyfriend. Incredibly handsome every guy wants to be him, and every girl wants to be with him. Bullies, but eventually learns to accept Emma.

KEVIN/ENSEMBLE (Male presenting, 16-18) Jock at school and Shelby's boyfriend. Nick's right hand and the class clown. Bullies, but eventually learns to accept Emma.

OLIVIA KEATING: Broadway reporter.

Hilarious and versatile character actors who will be playing the ensemble parts and building the world of our show. Strong actors and dancers. (Stage Age 16+) Opening Night Party Attendee High School Student Cast Member of the Non-Equity Tour of *Godspell* Monster Truck Rally Announcer and Attendees
