PLAYBILL[®]

How DID PLAYBILL GET ITS NAME? Source: <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Playbill</u>

What is known today as *Playbill* started in 1884, when Frank Vance Strauss founded the New York Theatre Program Corporation specializing in printing theater programs. Strauss reimagined the concept of a theater program, making advertisements a standard feature and thus transforming what was then a leaflet into a fully designed magazine. The new format proved popular with theatergoers, who started to collect playbills as souvenirs; however, the name *(The) Playbill* did not appear until the 1930s while earlier programs published by the company simply bore the name of the venue.
